JOB SEARCH WORKSHOPS OFFERED IN PERKASIE

ACE THE INTERVIEW: Learn interviewing techniques that focus on behavioral and traditional interview questions. Learn how to answer the hardest questions in an interview and the importance of follow up.

CUT YOUR JOB SEARCH BY 50%: Make your job search as efficient and effective as possible. Tips on being organized, efficient, using social media effectively and how networking is critical for the job search.

FINDING A JOB AFTER 50: Join the growing number of job seekers over 50 to receive guidance on job search issues specific to this age group.

OPEN LAB: Use this time to work on computers to learn or practice keyboarding; computer basics; writing emails; Microsoft Office Word, Excel, PowerPoint; and other basic computer skills. Have your email login and password for your email account if working on emailing.

RESUME REVIVAL: Update your resume during this workshop, including critique and formatting. Must come with a hard paper copy of your resume and have access to it electronically. For best results, bring a flash drive and have access to your email and Job Gateway accounts (including passwords). Prepared walk-ins may be accepted if space is available. **Starts promptly; late comers may not be accommodated.**

WRITING A COVER LETTER: Resumes don't tell your full story to a potential employer. This workshop will lead you through writing an effective cover letter to provide a better snapshot of you as an employee and highlight the value you bring. If you have a cover letter, bring it for critiquing and/or a flash drive if possible.

ASSESSMENTS OFFERED IN PERKASIE

CAREERSCOPE: Provides participants with an interest inventory and aptitude assessment for career decisions. (1½ hours)

TABE TEST: Test of Adult Basic Skills, provides participant with academic grade equivalency in Math and Reading. (1½ hours)

High School Equivalency Preparation HSE/GED/ABLE: Registration, Orientation & Assessment (3 hours)
